Flinchum - presiding; Mayor Pro Tem John N. McDermon Councilwoman Susan H. Gordon; Councilman Jesse A. Stigall; Town Manager Megan M. Garner; and Town Clerk Dora K. Moore. Councilman Ricky S. Plunkett was unable to attend.

A moment of silence was held.

<u>Adoption of Agenda:</u> Councilwoman Susan H. Gordon made a motion to adopt the agenda as presented. Mayor Pro Tem John N. McDermon seconded the motion, and the motion passed unanimously.

Councilman Jesse A. Stigall made a motion to approve and seal the June 7, 2021 closed session minutes. Mayor Pro Tem John N. McDermon seconded the motion, and the motion passed unanimously.
