

Town Mulch (First Come, First Serve Basis)

The Town's Public Works Department will be delivering leaf mulch the week of: April 19 - April 23 (Weather Permitting)

Deadline to sign up: Thursday, April 15

Residents living inside Town limits will be served first.

To receive mulch, residents must:

- 1. Complete and sign a waiver (allows Town employees and equipment onto your property and releases Town of any liability). Click here to print a mulch waiver, or visit the "Yard Waste" section of the "Services" tab at www.ruralhall.com.
- 2. Pick up a yard stake from Town Hall (423 Bethania-Rural Hall Road) and place it in your yard where you would like your mulch delivered.

No need to complete a waiver if we already have one on file, but you will need to pick up a stake and have your name added to the delivery list. Waivers and yard stakes can be picked up and waivers can be dropped off during office hours at the Town of Rural Hall, located at 423 Bethania-Rural Hall Road:

Monday - Thursday, 8:30 AM - 4:30 PM and Friday, 8:30 AM - 4:00 PM

Completed waivers can also be placed in our outside drop box, scanned and emailed to townhall@ruralhall.com, or mailed to PO Box 549, Rural Hall, NC 27045.

We will contact you if there is an issue delivering your mulch. Please make sure we have the best daytime contact number to reach you. Should weather delay delivery, the Town will deliver mulch as soon as possible after weather conditions improve. Initially, the Town will deliver no more than one truck load per household. If more than one load is requested, additional loads will be delivered as quantities allow.

Mulch will NOT be available or delivered after the designated time period.



NCDOT Update

The EC portion (NC-65 Interchange) of the R-2247 project is nearly complete. Some finishing touches are being made to the arch panels on the new NC-65 bridge. There could be a couple of lane closures due to the finalization of the panels.

Progress on the EB portion (I-74 Connector) of the R-2247 project is picking up as temperatures warm up. During April, you can expect to see mass dirt moving as US 52 alignment/widening continues. Weather permitting, four bridges along the new US 52 Southbound alignment should be complete by this summer. The NCDOT is still on schedule to open the new US 52 Southbound section this year. This will allow the next phase of construction to start on US 52 Northbound, as well as part of the new I-74 Beltway.

The NCDOT will have periodic lane closures over the next few weeks to continue repairing a stretch of US 52, between Hanes Mill Road in Winston-Salem and Main Street in King. Most work will take place outside of peak traffic hours, but there may be times when work extends into peak traffic times due to weather conditions. The NCDOT would like to remind motorists to pay extra attention to crew members and work zones.
