Rural Hall Garden Club Gardening Ideas for September.

In the south, September can be unpredictable. Sometimes the weather is sunny and mild while other times the heat of the summer drags on or there's excessive rainfall. One thing we should do in the garden during this month is stop pruning and fertilizing, as you don't want to encourage new, tender growth just before cold weather arrives. Do continue watering plants, such as Fall vegetables that are still actively growing. Start bringing in houseplants that you have kept outdoors during the summer, but first inspect them for insects and other pests that you don't want to bring inside. Clean and store flower pots for next year. Harvest seeds and keep in a cool dry place for next Spring planting. September is a great time to plant Daffodils and Spring flowering bulbs. Add a little Bone Meal Fertilizer to the soil for bigger blooms. About the middle of the month is a great time to start work on the lawns-aerating and sowing grass seed. In addition, Autumn is the best time to plant trees. Be sure to dig the holes twice the size of the root ball. Plant level with the top of the ground and add about 4 inches of mulch pulling back away from tree trunks. Water occasionally anytime we have a dry spell for the first year. Starting in October, the Garden Club will be meeting inside at the Nazareth Lutheran Church with a guest speaker, followed by a break for refreshments then a brief business meeting.

Our family garden club has been organized for Rural Hall and surrounding area to help promote Rural Hall's theme, *"Garden Spot of the World."* Men, women and children (ages 12 and up) are welcome and invited to join us.
